



733 million

people worldwide suffered from chronic undernourishment, accounting for about 9.1% of the global population
(WHO)



Hunger distribution by region:

- ← Africa: The most affected continent
- ← West and Central Africa: In 2024, 49.5 million people are expected to face hunger

MAIN CAUSES



Over **700 million** people (about 9% of the global population) live on **less than \$2.15** a day, limiting their access to food
(World Bank, 2022)



During the COVID-19 pandemic, food supply disruptions led to a **30% increase in global hunger**, pushing **161 million** people into food insecurity
(World Food Programme)




The global population reached **8 billion in 2023**, with over **80%** of growth occurring in regions where food production often lags behind demand
(UN World Population Prospects, 2022)



Approximately **65%** of the **343 million** people facing acute hunger are in countries affected by conflict
(World Food Programme)



Extreme weather causes an estimated **23% of agricultural losses** annually
(UN Food and Agriculture Organisation (FAO))
